



CEDIA 2015 Attendees Can Tour ITDRC Mobile Command Center Serving Firefighters, Flood Victims

Non-Profit Information Technology Disaster Resource Center aims to heighten awareness of its tech services for communities facing disaster

DALLAS, TX, October 13, 2015 – The [Information Technology Disaster Resource Center \(ITDRC\)](#), today announced it will offer tours of its Mobile Technology Command & Recovery Center during [CEDIA Expo 2015](#) in booth #6621 at the Kay Bailey Hutchinson Convention Center in Dallas October 15-17.

ITDRC, a 501(c)(3) non-profit that provides emergency communications and technology solutions to communities in times of disaster, will showcase its 40-foot flagship bus that most recently served near the frontlines of Washington state's large-scale wildfire containment efforts. Following the CEDIA Expo, the bus then immediately heads to South Carolina to assist in flood recovery efforts.

Containing VSAT connectivity, network infrastructure, workstations, hotspots, telephony, and radio communications, the command center is often one of the few conduits for responders and citizens to gain communications when they're needed most. ITDRC's ongoing tours throughout the CEDIA event in Dallas aim to heighten awareness of ITDRC's capabilities, sign up volunteer technologists, and increase financial and equipment donations.

In June, ITDRC was named a member of the new [Tech Corps](#) program administered by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). The program created a unique opportunity for a formal relationship between FEMA and those who want to assist in the private sector. By joining the Tech Corps program, ITDRC expanded its reach not only to help victims of disaster, but to more efficiently work in tandem with technology organizations to do so.

Other members of the program include Cisco Systems, Google, Humanity Road, Intel and Microsoft, among others. All members work with emergency managers to identify and define critical gaps and then help coordinate volunteer technology resources in times of disaster.
